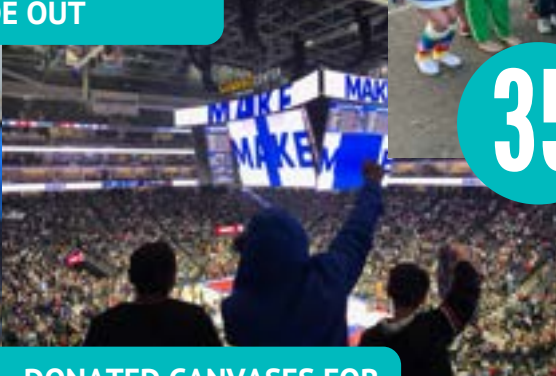

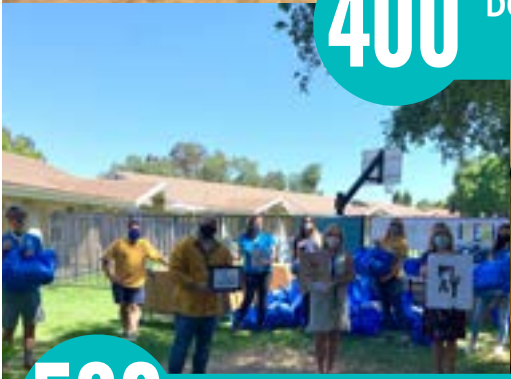

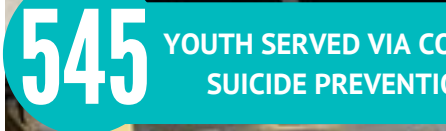

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

As we sat down to compile this report, it felt a bit like cracking open a time capsule. Was it only a year ago that we commemorated our 75th anniversary of the Children's Receiving Home of Sacramento? Could it have been just last October that we laced up our sneakers along the sparkling American River for our 5K run/walk? Is it possible that it has been nearly nine months since we were last able to take our kids on a group outing (an integral part of their wellness and social-emotional development)?

I remain in awe of the resilience our kids demonstrate on a daily basis. During the pandemic I've seen them adapt to remote schooling, adjust to taking meals in their dorms instead of our dining hall, and channel their energy into countless art projects and creative outdoor games. It has not been easy, and while there have been definitely also been some creative expressions of frustration, they are showing a tremendous adaptive spirit during this scary and uncertain time. Likewise, the incredible team members who choose to do this physically and often emotionally-exhausting job continue to wow me with their level of care and dedication to the kids and each other.

In May we said farewell to David Ballard, who helmed CRH for 23 years. David led the agency through multiple expansions, oversaw our implementation of California's Continuum of Care Reform and made lasting connections with countless CRH alumni, staff and community members. We remain in close contact – he's been enjoying further expanding his knowledge of California history and spending quality time with his wife and family, while continuing to advocate for our region's children. My career has focused on empowering vulnerable children and helping families achieve success and stability, both at CRH and several peer agencies, and I was honored to be asked by our Board of Directors to lead the Children's Receiving Home into our next chapter serving children in crisis.

During fiscal year 20-21 my priorities are safety, well-being and permanence. As one of only five state-licensed Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Programs in the region, the Children's Receiving Home is integral to keeping local kids who have intense needs here in the community, connected with relatives and more likely to achieve a permanent family placement. We plan to expand our Partial Hospitalization day treatment program to offer skilled mental health services an even greater number of pre-teens and teens dealing with anxiety, depression and mental health issues. We continue to emphasize safety, sanitization and social distancing – doing everything possible to continue quality, compassionate service while also limiting germ transmission during the colder months ahead.

The COVID era has affected all of us in countless and varied ways, and I know that for many it has had a deeply personal and tragic impact. My heart goes out to everyone who has lost someone dear to them. To each person, family, business or community organization who has found creative solutions to continue your philanthropy – whether toward the Children's Receiving Home and/or any of our fellow local nonprofit organizations – I am eternally grateful and inspired by your dedication to our community.

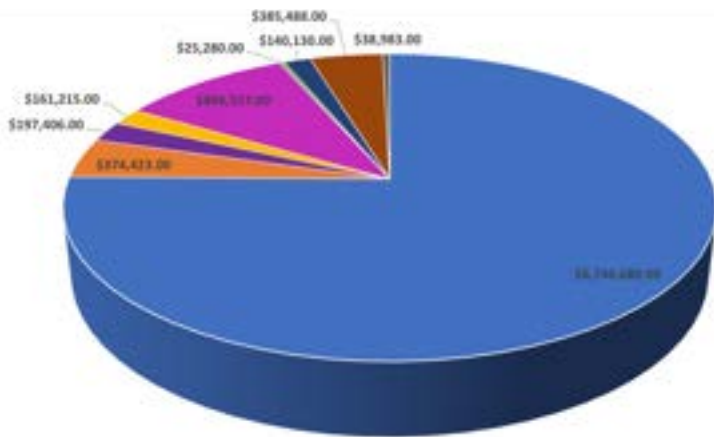
