# CEO UPDATE

For 16 years our agency has been a leader in providing mental health services to children and adolescents throughout our region. I am proud to say that our team is prepared to address any need presented by youth; whether via our residential treatment program, our partial hospitalization program, our trauma-informed preschool, or our community-based suicide prevention program. We hear from many young people and their families who tell us that the care they received here was life-changing.

A 2021 "State of Student Mental Wellness" survey found that 83% of California students did not feel their mental health needs were being met, 45% were depressed, and 63% had recently experienced an emotional meltdown. No matter age, zip code, background, or family structure, our community's children are affected by debilitating anxiety, stress, depression - even suicidal thoughts. We stand ready to help them and their families.

Thankfully our intensive treatment services, therapeutic groups, recreational activities and incentives motivate children and teens to successfully complete our programs and return home to a safe family environment. This year we



helped nearly 500 young people across all of our programs and celebrated many graduations and successes. Thank you for your partnership and for helping even more children heal.

## STORIES OF HOPE



A 16-year-old on the Autism Spectrum had difficulty engaging with peers and adults. Because of trauma as a young child, he struggled with trusting anyone new. Over time - with a lot of consistency and therapy - he worked his way through our program and returned home to his parents. He graduated from high school in June 2022.



A 15-year-old female client in the Partial Hospitalization Program struggled with depression, anger, anxiety, and suicidal ideation. She came to our program and excelled. The family began using the coping skills we taught. She left our program better able to manage the symptoms that were once debilitating and with a multitude of new coping skills in her toolbox.

# OUR PROGRAMS



## PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION PROGRAM

The Partial Hospitalization Program provides hospital diversion and post-hospitalization treatment in a day treatment setting to youth in a safe, home-like, confidential, environment. CRH's experienced team provides intensive and effective treatment delivered through structured services.



## RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM

Our Residential Treatment program serves children and teenagers struggling with trauma, emotional, or behavioral issues that may require individualized, intensive therapy to transition back to a family environment. We provide around-the-clock care and supervision to youth ages 6-21.



## SUPPORTING COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

Supporting Community Connections (SCC) is a suicide prevention outreach program for transitional-aged youth in the foster, homeless, and LGBTQ+ communities. SCC offers services that teach youth how to use resources to promote health and well-being. All services are available to youth ages 12-25 in Sacramento County.



## SPROUTS

Sprouts is a special trauma informed-care preschool that serves the youngest survivors of abuse and neglect through an innovative and trauma-informed curriculum. Healing is emphasized in all areas of child development, including social, emotional, physical, cognitive, and school readiness.

## OUR MISSION

The Children's Receiving Home of Sacramento is committed to positively impacting the lives of children, youth, and families affected by abuse, neglect, behavioral health issues, and trauma in California.

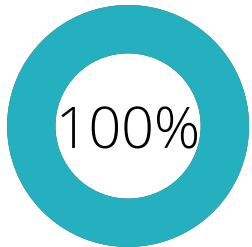
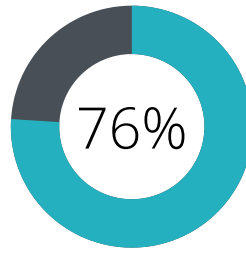

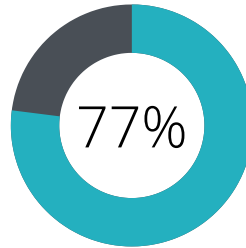
# OUR IMPACT

As mental health provider shortages continue throughout our region, the role of the Children's Receiving Home of Sacramento is more vital than ever. We are one of only five agencies across greater Sacramento that provide around-the-clock care and supervision to children and teens struggling with mental, emotional, or behavioral issues.

During my service as a member of the Board, I've had the opportunity to volunteer and work directly with the kids we serve. They often struggle to trust our team and open up to our mental health providers. But once they feel comfortable sharing their story and accepting help, we know we've made a difference.

Unfortunately, the costs to provide this level of care to our kids far exceeds the amount the state pays for our services. That's why we are partnering with the California Alliance of Child & Family Services to fight for the funding we need to serve our kids. Increased funding will enable us to recruit and retain incredible care providers who are trained and ready to meet the needs of each individual youth coming into our care.

In addition to government support, the contributions donors like you make in our work ensures that we are able to meet each unique therapeutic need presented by our youth, grant them a sense of normalcy during their time with us and motivate their participation in our therapeutic programs. 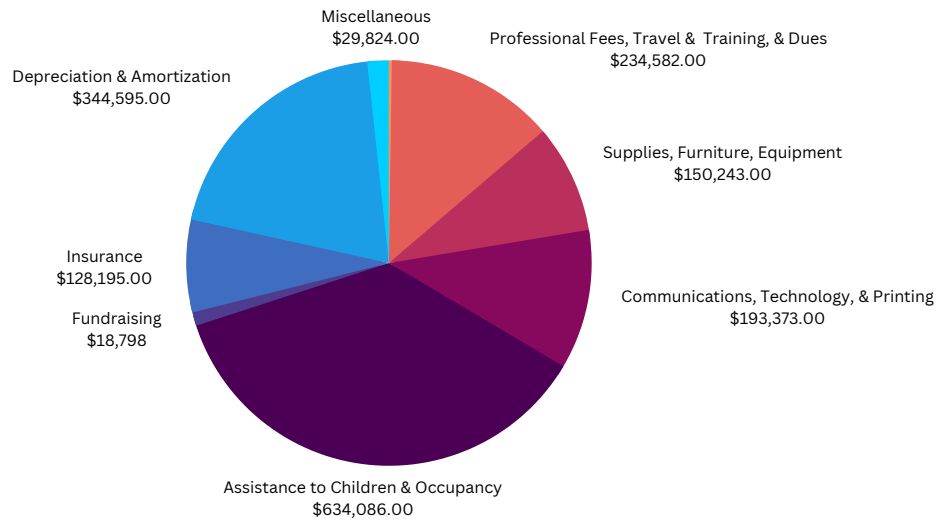

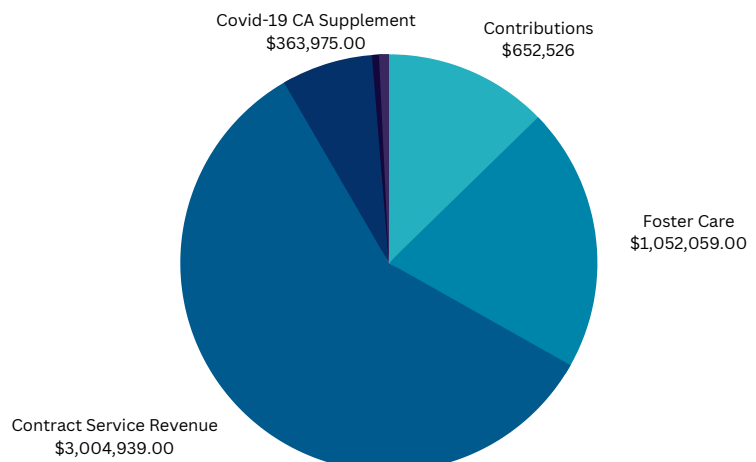
